From Blogger to Supreme Court Clerk

From his earliest memories, **Justin Walker '00** was interested in the political process. He was putting up political yard signs at age four or five. His most memorable occurred during his senior year at Duke University when he received permission to do an independent study project to observe the Democratic Primary process including Iowa, New Hampshire, and South Carolina.

During this odyssey, Justin was fortunate enough to engage with many candidates. Justin maintains that this process is the quintessential distillation of the American political system. Low security and close contact with the voters make this "politics at its best" as the candidates are truly "put through the gauntlet" of "face-to-face questions that keep the politicians on their toes." The process is physically, emotionally, and mentally demanding.

Justin wrote a blog for Duke detailing this experience which set his career in motion. Following graduation in 2004, he was a speechwriter for Donald Rumsfeld. In 2011, Justin was named to *Forbes Magazine's* "30 Under 30," with Harvard Law School and clerkships for Supreme Court Justice Anthony Kennedy and Federal Appellate Judge Brett Kavanaugh on his resume. Until this past July, he was one of five clerks serving as a lawyer for Justice Kennedy.

In November, Justin began work for the Gibson Dunn Law Firm in Washington, D.C. He married Anne Browning Walker, a fellow Duke graduate and author of the recently released romance novel, "The Booby Trap." She is a fervent Duke fan and a Democrat. Justin grew up an avid UK fan and a Republican. Love is truly blind!

At 66-years-old, Jack Wheatley decided he wouldn't let his age get in the way of his dreams. So on February 7, 2012, the former CEO of Southwest Hospital started the journey of a lifetime. In 64 days, he would ride 3,200 miles on his trusty Raleigh road bike; a ride that had been 40 years in the making. Equipped with a tent, a 357 Magnum, and more Oreos than he'd like to admit, Wheatley trekked from Dog Beach in San Diego, Calif., to Jacksonville Beach in Florida.

He will remember the seven broken spokes, the eight flat tires, and the bent rim that nearly ended his journey. He will remember the 20-degree night in the mountains of California and the 40 miles-per-hour dust storm in New Mexico.

However, his fondest memories are of the people he met along the way. He beamed when he spoke of the evening he spent with a former Coast Guard pilot, a "true American hero" that he met on the side of a Florida back road. He laughed when he told the story of the odd couple he met in a Texas diner, one of whom was a *National Geographic* photographer, the other a mountain lion hunter. He enjoyed the solitude that ride afforded him, but he also cherished the end of the day when he called his wife.

"This ride strengthened my faith in America," said Wheatley. And he hopes that his journey will inspire others to pursue their dreams.

Cleaning up with Biotech

The next time you spill marinara sauce on a clean, white shirt, don't worry. **Doug Crabb '68** has a solution to your problem.

After taking Biology and AP Biology at St. X under Brother Leroy, Doug decided to become a scientist, continuing his education at Ohio State University (BS Genetics) and the UofL School of Medicine (PhD in Microbial Genetics '77). Following a Post-doctoral Fellowship, he began work in the emerging biotechnology industry. In 1982 he helped found Genencor International, which



grew to be the world's premier industrial biotechnology company. There Doug began designing improved functional properties into enzymes. In layman's terms, Doug developed biology-based solutions to replace chemical products and processes. After a 30-year career at Genencor, Doug retired as VP Technology to concentrate on cooking, scuba diving, and travel with Delores, his wife of 42 years.

And the marinara sauce? One of Doug's key Genencor achievements was the development of an enzyme to replace the chemical bleach in Tide detergent. While effective in removing stains, the bleach damaged the fabric. So, Doug created a stain-eating enzyme that replaced millions of tons of chemical bleach world-wide with a biodegradable product. Over the years, he's been involved with all aspects of designing biological organisms to replace a wide range of chemical products and processes in diverse areas, such as textile processing, food ingredients, and fuel from biomass and even chemical production.

Now, Doug encourages students to consider science careers with this job description: "Quite simply, my job is to wonder about things and then use that curiosity to figure out better, safer, and cleaner ways to achieving what we need done." Built on a science start at St. X, Doug Crabb has certainly made a better place for all of us.

Academic Accomplishments

Saint Xavier's Class of 2013 features an exceptional group of academic talent with 22 seniors having been named National Merit Semifinalists (pictured in the photo) and another 14 joining them as Commended Students. This is the largest number of seniors recognized by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation for their standardized test scores since 2009. Additionally, the senior class has produced two additional

perfect ACT scores. **Hunter French** and **Nick Sehlinger** have each scored a 36, and they join **Jon Fish** with this distinct honor.

This past summer, College Board announced that more than 91% of St. X students that took Advanced Placement exams last May earned scores that qualified them to receive college credit. A total of 109 students that sat for the exams were named AP Scholars

by College Board, which requires a score of at least 3 or higher (out of 5) on three or more exams. Four of them, **Alex Goebel**, **Andrew Miller**, **John Ramsey**, and **Vincent Stephen**, all members of the Class of 2012, were named National AP Scholars for their outstanding performance on all of their AP exams taken. In all, 262 sophomores, juniors, and seniors took 607 Advanced Placement exams in 22 different subjects.





The Tigers celebrate with Coach Mike Glaser '70 following the final regular season home game of his 31-year career as Head Football Coach.





Clark Burckle forced his burning arms to sweep through the water one more time. He whipped his legs and lunged forward, stretching desperately for the wall. Thirteen thousand people roared as his fingers made contact with the touchpad, finishing his third 200-meter breaststroke in two days. He gasped for air and tried to decipher the glowing scoreboard above his head. Dizzy from exertion, he was able to make out his name and the number four next to it.

Disappointment flooded his body. He looked again at the board, not wanting to believe that he had barely missed finishing in the top two and landing a spot on the United

States Olympic team. This time, he realized that the four next to his name was his lane number. On the other side of his name was the time: 2 minutes, 9.97 seconds. Next to that was the number two. Clark ripped off his swim cap, screamed, and smacked the water in front of him. The **2006** Saint Xavier graduate was an Olympian, earning his spot by just eight one-hundredths of a second. Four years earlier, Clark's sister, Caroline, made the Olympic team as a member of the 4x200 meter freestyle relay, eventually earning a bronze medal. Clark also swam in the 2008 Olympic trials, making the eight-man finals in both the 200 breaststroke and 400 individual medley, but seeing his sister make the Olympic team was the highlight and inspiration of the meet.

After 2008, Clark significantly changed his lifestyle as he worked toward making the Olympic team. He switched colleges after his junior year, from Florida to Arizona. He began to focus his training solely on breaststroke, because spots in the IM events were virtually locked up by superstars Michael Phelps and Ryan Lochte. He also altered his diet and his mental approach to training.

Clark says he was always very invested mentally in swimming, to the point of putting too much pressure on himself.

"I wanted to perform well every single race, but obviously there's always going to be some bad swims," Clark said. "I've worked on not beating myself up over a bad race."

The net result of Clark's hard work and training adjustments was his own Olympic experience. In London, he marched in the Opening Ceremony and cheered on his swimming teammates for the first few days of competition. On the morning of the fourth day, Clark prepared for his preliminary swim. As he made his way to the notoriously intense staging areas, his excitement gave way to anxiety.

"I was nervous to see how I would perform," Clark explained. "The format of tapering for Trials and then again for the Olympics was different than anything I'd ever done before."

Clark handled the nerves of his first Olympic swim brilliantly, posting a lifetime best time of 2:09.55 that placed him second in his heat and earned the sixth overall seed heading into the semifinal.

That night he returned for the semifinal and experienced the scariest moment of his time in London.

"As we were lining up before the semis, they told me my suit didn't have the proper identification, so I had to run back to the dressing room, change suits, and then run back to the staging area," he said.

Clark overcame the adverse moment and swam another lifetime best, 2:09.11 and earned a spot in the eight-man final.

The final was the first event in the following night's session. Clark was in lane seven and started the race with his usual lightning-quick reaction time off the blocks. The crowd was frenzied as the race progressed, with Hungarian Daniel Gyurta battling crowd favorite Michael Jamison of Great Britain for first. Clark fought to keep pace. Ultimately, Gyurta took the gold medal with a world-record time, and Clark touched the wall sixth. His time of 2:09.25 was fractionally slower than his preliminary time and less than two seconds slower than Gyurta's in the fastest 200 breaststroke race in history.

Currently, Clark is preparing for the 2013 World Championships in Barcelona. His seven-days-a-week training includes multiple double sessions.

"I feel like I keep getting better as I get older and more mature, so I'm not ready to stop yet," he says.

After that, Clark wants to pursue a graduate degree and possibly a position as a graduate assistant swim coach. Eventually, he envisions a career in business.

No matter what the future holds for Clark Burkle, his success as an Olympian has already inspired hundreds of young swimmers. He has made America, St. X, and himself proud.
